ARTICLE 1: ROLE OF THE PANEL

The 2019 Kansas Statewide Early Childhood Care and Education Needs Assessment finds that greater systems alignment is needed to fully realize an efficient and robust early childhood care and education infrastructure. This informs Goal 1: State-Level Coordination, of the <u>All in for Kansas</u> <u>Kids Strategic Plan</u>, which outlines the steps needed to ensure the early childhood care and education system is structured and aligned for maximum impact.



State-Level Coordination



- Development of a more cohesive cross-agency "early childhood system" at the state level with respect to roles, effectiveness, funding streams, common terminology and goal-setting.
- Better understanding of the various organization and developing a shared understanding of how to promote equitable access to high quality early childhood learning opportunities for each and every child and their family.
- Connecting the early learning community in a way that creates a strong altruistic community ready to activate opportunities and find unusual, positive solutions that lead to good public policy.



All of the stakeholders involved in this project bring different perspectives to the table. Many times, I feel each stakeholder group operates in its own "bubble". I am hopeful that through this project, the communication and collaboration among all of the stakeholders will serve to strengthen those relationships. It is important for each stakeholder group to understand and respect the roles of the others. With better understanding, it becomes possible to bridge the gaps between the state agencies, community partners, the private sector, and families served, to improve the quality of early childhood in Kansas. ARTICLE 1: ROLE OF THE PANEL

The Kansas Early Childhood Recommendations Panel is an advisory group to the Kansas Children's Cabinet and Trust Fund. It plays a key role in enabling our state to implement the All in for Kansas Kids strategic plan, respond to challenges, elevate recommendations from communities and stakeholders, and make key decisions to help us achieve the vision outlined in our strategic plan.



ARTICLE 1: ROLE OF THE PANEL

- Kansas Executive Order 20-02 designates the Kansas Children's Cabinet and Trust Fund ("Children's Cabinet") as the State Advisory Council on Early Childhood Education and Care.
 - It states, "In order to support the Cabinet in fulfilling [these duties], the Cabinet shall convene and maintain a panel of volunteers ("the Panel") with demonstrable early childhood expertise to operate at the pleasure of the Cabinet in an advisory role. The Executive Director of the Kansas Children's Cabinet and Trust Fund shall coordinate the activities of the Panel on behalf of the Cabinet. The Kansas Children's Cabinet and Trust Fund shall provide ongoing direction to the Panel, delineating areas in which it would benefit from the Panel's expertise and establishing responsibilities, governance, and reporting structures as it finds beneficial."



ARTICLE 2: PANEL MEMBERSHIP

ARTICLE 3: PANEL NORMS

Child- and family-centered

Equity

- Leadership is an activity, not a position. Anyone can lead, anytime, anywhere.
 - Can we give the work back?
 - We are **all** early childhood stakeholders.
- We will work transparently and accountably.

- We will use strengths-based language.
- →We will use clear language.
- Panel members will make clear when they are representing an agency's or organization's point of view. Otherwise, it will be assumed that the viewpoint represents the panel member as a professional in the field of early childhood.

recommendations will include the following:

- Clear identification of the entity that will receive the recommendation
- •Background information explaining the issue that includes:
 - Description of how considerations of equity have informed this recommendation
 - o Description of how Kansas families have shaped this recommendation
 - Description of the councils, committees, or workgroups with expertise, experience, or jurisdiction related to the issue



ARTICLE 4: PANEL ACTIONS

The Panel may contact other councils, committees, and workgroups with expertise, experience, or jurisdiction related to a particular issue to share information gathered and identify opportunities for further progress. The Panel may also contact other councils, committees, and workgroups to request additional information or feedback on draft recommendations.

The Panel may provide recommendations, information, or requests for information or feedback at any point during the year. The Panel will provide an annual report summarizing its work to the Kansas Children's Cabinet and Trust Fund.



ARTICLE 5: MEETING PROCEDURES

The Panel shall be subject to the Kansas Open Meetings Act:

- "A representative government is dependent upon an informed electorate." The policy of the State of Kansas is that "meetings for the conduct of governmental affairs and the transaction of governmental business be open to the public" (K.S.A. 75-4317).

- If a group is subject to the Kansas Open Meetings Act, what are they required to do? There are two main requirements: (a) Their meetings must be open and (b) Notice of meetings must be (individually) provided to those requesting notice. All meetings subject to the Kansas Open Meetings Act must be conducted openly - that means that the public must be allowed to listen to the discussion.

- When does a meeting take place? A meeting of a public body subject to the Kansas Open Meetings Act has three elements; (a) An interactive discussion (NOTE: discussion alone triggers the Kansas Open Meetings Act, it is not necessary that action or votes be taken); (b) by and between at least a majority of the body; (c) on matters relating to the functions of that body. All three elements must be present to trigger the Kansas Open Meetings Act.

- Can members of a public body subject to the Kansas Open Meetings Act use other people, the telephone, notes, or email to privately discuss public matters? Not if it involves a majority of the public body. If an interactive discussion on the affairs of the body takes place, among the threshold minimum number of members, it is subject to the Kansas Open Meetings Act. It does not matter what method is used to conduct the discussion.

- Can members attend a general interest meeting of another group? Yes, as long as they refrain from any private discussions on the affairs of their body, they may attend conferences where general topics are being presented.

ARTICLE 5: MEETING PROCEDURES

Voting:

- The Panel will strive first for consensus in decision making.
- ▶ If consensus is not possible, participants may call for a vote.
- Each Panel member is entitled to one vote on each matter submitted to a vote.
- A vote of two-thirds of those members present is necessary to approve any formal action taken by the Panel pursuant to Article 4: Panel Actions.
- The votes of Panel members participating virtually shall be included on matters submitted to a vote.



ARTICLE 5: MEETING PROCEDURES

Typical procedures for the Kansans' Open Forum shall be as follows:

- Each speaker shall be allowed to speak for three minutes.
- Panel members may ask clarifying questions of the person making the presentation. The speaker will have up to one minute to respond. The presiding officer may grant additional time.
- Information may be submitted to the Panel in written and electronic form. This information shall be included in the meeting minutes.
- Following the Kansans' Open Forum portion of the agenda, the presiding officer will acknowledge the participants and announce that the Panel will determine if any of the issues will be addressed at future meetings.
- In the event of a meeting conducted virtually, the Panel may require that it will only accept written comments. The posted agenda shall outline the procedures for providing written feedback.
