- Compile a list of ideas to reform, refresh, and launch a new campaign




GOOD BEGINNINGS LAST A LIFETIME

- The Good Beginnings Last a Lifetime (GBLL) tagline was branded in 1999.
- Materials included a pamphlet, orientation curriculum and a short video highlighting an initial survey and health and safety regulation requirements.
- The target audience was potential child care providers and the materials were intended to better prepare the applicant and ensure a successful application submission and initial survey.
