2019 NEEDS ASSESSMENT - KEY FINDINGS

KEY FINDING: Availability

"Gaps exist across the early childhood system but are concentrated in a few key areas: parenting skills, basic and economic supports, **child care**, crisis services, and health care...Child care is a significant need, **especially infant care**, **care during nontraditional hours**, and care for children with special needs."



2019 NEEDS ASSESSMENT - KEY FINDINGS

KEY FINDING: Availability

"Families with young children experience a gap between the services that are available and their actual needs, disproportionately affecting vulnerable and underserved populations."



2019 NEEDS ASSESSMENT - KEY FINDINGS

KEY FINDING: Facilities

"There is limited funding and funding flexibility for providers to make **capital improvements**, despite the importance of physical infrastructure to the safety of children and staff. Additional learning materials and enhancements to environments are also needed to ensure **children of all abilities and cultural and linguistic backgrounds** have high-quality and developmentally appropriate experiences in their early years."


COMMITMENT TO EQUITY



PARTNERSHIP FOR THE FUTURE

A post-pandemic **public-private partnership** structure to:

 Develop a portfolio of innovations ranging from action labs (small investments for safe-to-fail experiments) to demonstration projects (larger, one-time investments in future-focused business plans that address the needs unveiled in our 2019 Needs Assessment).

A post-pandemic **public-private partnership** structure to:

- facilitate locally-driven and state-supported partnerships that nurture ideas into solid innovations
- ensure that the needs of the present are met while considering the needs of future generations
- amplify the reach of innovative and entrepreneurial leaders across the State



FUTURE PROSPERITY - ROOTED IN EARLY CHILDHOOD

The Children's Cabinet recognizes that our shared present and future prosperity is rooted in early childhood. Kansas children stand to benefit if we **treat investments in child care as a public good**.

- Strong ROI when children receive high-quality care in their earliest years



HI-CREST DEMONSTRATION PROJECT

To take action on our **commitment to equity**, and to increase **availability and affordability of quality child care** during traditional hours and on a drop-in basis in a highneed neighborhood –

One-time Grant of \$250,000 to support SENT in purchasing a recently-closed child care facility in Topeka's Hi-Crest neighborhood.



IMPACT - HI-CREST DEMONSTRATION PROJECT

- Support access to reliable care in a child care desert, enabling parents to work and/or pursue educational opportunities;
- Develop and strengthen the local child care workforce through apprenticeships, wage supplements, and partnerships with higher education; and
- Establish the new child care center as family engagement hub.

PROJECT LEAD - SENT OVERVIEW

Strengthening and Equipping Neighborhoods Together - SENT

- 501c3 nonprofit organization
- 3 Pillars:
 - Housing and Business Development (renovate affordable properties, etc.)
 - Cradle to Career Education (STEAM learning for children, etc.)
 - Health and Wellness (mental health services, etc.)
- Serve Children ages 6 weeks to 6 years old



HI-CREST NEIGHBORHOOD DATA

- 27% live below poverty line
 - 65% of children under 5 live below the poverty line
- Median income \$36,250
 - Shawnee County \$59,441, KS \$62,087
- Diverse neighborhood
 - o 39% white (non-Hispanic or Latino) compared to 75% white statewide
 - 26.2% Black or African American compared to 5.7% statewide



DISCUSSION - HI-CREST DEMONSTRATION PROJECT

- One-time \$250,000 grant toward facility costs.
- Proposed Grantee Requirements:
 - Participate in the same evaluation requirements as other Cabinet programs, including: The Accountability Process, Common Measures Initiative, addressing the Blueprint for Early Childhood, and others.
 - Recommended Department of Administration language: "...In the event the grantee ceases to provide or cause to be provided the above-described services at the purchased location within (some period) years of (specific date), grantee shall repay the granted amount to the Kansas Children's Cabinet
 - Conflict of Interest clearance
