

School Age

 Kansas Department of Health & Environment definition of "School-age child" and "child" mean an individual who is of kindergarten age through the academic year in which the child is in the sixth grade and who is attending the program. Each school-age child shall be included in the license capacity





School age programs

- 1. Building Base School Age Program: Operated out of a building- is not an outdoor summer camp or a mobile school age program
- 2. Outdoor Summer Camp School Age Program: a program that operates only during the summer months and is conducted at an outdoor location for the duration of the program but does not include any summer instructional camps.
- 3. Mobile summer program: a program that operates only during the summer months. Children and youth meet at a designated pick-up and drop-off site, and are transported daily to locations off the premises for program activities.





Additional options

Family child care:

Mixes ages, no more than 4 school age children.

Child Care Centers:

can be in a mixed age classroom or classroom with all school age children.


