A. Character Development

- 1. Foundations of Character Development
 - a. Develop understanding of right and wrong.
 - b. Foster caring attachments between fellow children, staff, and the community
 - c. Demonstrate mutual respect and utilize strategies to build a safe and productive culture.
 - d. Demonstrate actions and facilitate experiences that promote empathy, positive interactions and respectful relationships.
- B. Responsible Decision Making & Problem Solving
 - 1. Begin to develop the skills necessary to recognize and acknowledge the feelings and needs of others and how positive choices contribute to a safe community.
 - 2. Demonstrates awareness of personal time and responsibilities within predictable routines.
 - 3. Develop, implement and model effective problem-solving skills.
- C. Personal Development
 - 1. Self-Awareness
 - a. Expresses and develops an understanding of thoughts and emotions of self and others.

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
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CHILD CARE CAPACITY ACCELERATOR

Funding for construction, operations, and sustainability solutions!

- In a special Cabinet Meeting held on June 23rd the Kansas Children's Cabinet and Trust Fund approved \$43,593,294 in grant funding awards to 52 Kansas organizations and partnerships.
- The Accelerator will support community-based teams—including early childhood providers and champions, employers, and economic development leaders—in their efforts to create affordable and accessible child care seats within their communities.

CHILD CARE AWARE OF KANSAS LEGACY SCHOLARSHIP

The 2023 Legacy Scholarship created in honor of Leadell Ediger

- Up to \$1,700 towards an early childhood certificate at a Kansas community college.

 - Family child care providers
 - Child care center employees that work directly with children at least 30 hours per week
