







Tract with more than 50 children under age 5 and either no child care providers or more than 3x as many children as licensed care slots.

The purpose of this funding is to support community approaches to **addressing child care capacity**, specifically through new construction, significant expansion, and major renovations of physical child care facilities, launch operational support, and implementation of sustainable solutions.

Communities will utilize the funding to build or make critical improvements that **create additional** licensed child care slots that align with health and safety requirements and addresses systemic challenges to sustained child care capacity.

# **Purpose**



#### **Outcomes:**

- Increased number of licensed child care facilities
- Increased recruitment and retention of child care providers
- Increased number of licensed child care seats
- Improved community ratio of licensed child

The Child Care Innovation Communities is a competitive add-on to the full Accelerator Grant opportunity to specifically pilot targeted approaches and strategies to expand child care capacity in six innovation categories (see box below).

Grantees will participate in a 12-month cohort program that involves co-creation and peer learning, regular data reporting and rapid-cycle evaluation efforts, and monthly coaching sessions.

Innovation community applicants MUST have been eligible for and submitted a full Accelerator application.


