CHILD CARE CAPACITY ACCELERATOR

<u>Accelerator Purpose</u>: Support community-driven approaches to addressing child care capacity, specifically through capital and operational investments that **create additional and sustainable licensed child care slots**.

Additional \$11million from DCF through CCDF-ARPA funding for operations-only expenses. Utilizing \$425,500 of recovered SPARK funding resulting from previously-funded grantee who declined award.

All other elements as outlined in the RFP remained the same, including the requirement that projects add licensed child care slots and have a 25% community match.





Outcomes:

- Increased number of licensed child care facilities
- Increased recruitment and retention of child care providers
- Increased number of licensed child care seats
- Improved community ratio of licensed child

CHILD CARE CAPACITY ACCELERATOR

- \$11 million additional funding from CCDF ARPA made available on 9/7/2023
- **SPARK Funding** Utilizing \$425,500 of recovered SPARK funds from previous grantee who declined award
- 9/13/2023 Invitation to <u>all existing CCCA applicants</u> to submit projects that meet CCCA original RFP operations-only criteria via abbreviated application process
- 9/25/2023 Deadline to submit projects via the online portal
 - 37 applicants responded (18 previously funded with CCCA grant)
 - \$16.6 million in total requests with \$8.9 million in community match
- 6/30/2024 Spend deadline for additional CCCA grant funding



Community Based Child Abuse Prevention Renewal

2023-2024 CBCAP

- Funds Support Primary and Secondary Prevention Efforts
 - **Primary prevention** includes efforts targeted to the broader community to strengthen families and prevent the likelihood of abuse or neglect.
 - Secondary prevention targets efforts towards children and families atrisk for abuse and neglect as a means of providing strengthening support to families.
- August 5, 2023: Cabinet approved renewal of 7 current grantees (6 community-based, 1 statewide)
- September 15, 2023: Federal Grant Award Received

FY25 RFP RECOMMENDATION

- Cabinet approved new slate of awards on April 14, 2023
 - o 8 new grantees
 - o 18 returning grantees
- Recommending renewal applications for all 26 current grantees
 - CIF FY25 budget recommendation (6/2/23) included flat funding for ECBG





FY25 RFP TIMELINE

- Renewal Application Open on Kansas CommonApp portal early February 2024
- Renewal Applications Due Early March 2024
- KCCTF Staff Review Completed by mid-to-late March 2024
- KCCTF Vote on FY25 Awards during April 5, 2024 meeting

CAPITAL PROJECTS FUND ACCELERATOR OVERVIEW

Purpose: fund construction of community facilities that support employment, health monitoring, education, and child care needs of families.

Outcomes:

- Increased number of individuals receiving access to education, including early childhood education
- Increased access to physical, mental, and/or behavioral health needs in the community
- Increased access to supports that enable work, including broadband
- Increased access to full-day/full-year child care for children birth to 5 years



CAPITAL PROJECTS FUND ACCELERATOR OVERVIEW

- o\$38 million total
- Funding Source US Treasury (Broadband funding)
- Construction-only
- Projects must have explicit design considerations to enable ALL of the following: licensed child care, work, education, and health monitoring
- Must have operational sustainability plan + 15% project asset match


