

How do Kansas families find help and support to meet their needs?






- Be confident discussing & assessing families' needs
- Understand what resources are available
- Know the most direct way to connect families to resources
- Be informed whether the family received help
- Form relationships and communicate with other providers



Technology and collaboration can equip providers to create more right doors for families




IRIS Integrated Referral and Intake System

- Closed-loop referral platform connecting individuals and families with the right services to meet their needs
- Simple for providers to identify available resources, make referrals, and monitor whether families receive the help they choose
- Promotes individual and community health and well-being





What makes an IRIS Network?





A network of organizations tethered not just by their use of the same technology but by aligned vision, shared practice & accountability, and ongoing collaboration.





Growing Collaboration & Practice





GROUNDWORK

Assess community readiness and develop a leadership team.

PLANTING SEEDS

Engage partners and create a collective vision for the future.



STRONG ROOTS

Collaboratively map the network, define shared processes, and develop shared expectations.



IRIS BLOOMS


Implement defined workflows to connect families to services.

If your community does **not** have an IRIS Network


- Reflect on families' current experience finding help in your community. What could be improved? Where might families fall through the cracks?



BRIGHT SPOTS

A caller shared that she was terminated from her job, has no means of transportation, and is concerned about providing food for her family. The phone counselor provided the caller with resources for emergency food assistance in her area that would deliver to her home.


A mom called 1-800-CHILDREN at 9 pm, concerned about her young daughter's separation anxiety. The family had recently experienced divorce and remarriage. The phone counselor shared information on anxiety and trauma, and recommended the child and family participate in counseling with a mental health professional. When the phone counselor called to follow up, the mom shared that she had scheduled an appointment with a counselor in her neighborhood.

An 85-year-old woman called, needing assistance with her broken heater and weatherizing her home for the colder months. The phone counselor called a weatherization program and confirmed that the program would be able to assist the caller. The phone counselor followed up to ensure the caller was able to connect with the program.





Major Head Start Changes Proposed!

- On November 20th the Office of Head Start issued a <u>Notice of Proposed Rulemaking</u>, Supporting the Head Start Workforce and Consistent Quality Programming, with major proposed updates to the <u>Head Start Program Performance Standards</u>
- This proposal represents the most consequential changes to Head Start since the 2015 reauthorization
