- April 24, 2023: KDHE reg review project began
- June 24, 2023: First public engagement session
- July 22, 2023: Second public engagement session.
- September 27, 2023: Internal concurrence completed by KDHE
- September 28, 2023: Regulation packet sent to DoA for review
- October 9, 2023: Approved by DoA; submitted to the Office of the Attorney General (AG)

KDHE Update



CHILD CARE REGULATIONS TIMELINE

- March 19, 2024: Approved by Office of the Attorney General
- March 28, 2024: Notice of Public Hearing Public Comment period began
- April 25, 2024: Presented to Joint Committee on Administrative Rules and Regulations.
- June 4, 2024: The public hearing on proposed changes end of public comment
- July 18, 2024: Publication in the Kansas Register
- August 2, 2024: Regulations take full effect

OVERVIEW

Community-Based Child Abuse Prevention (CBCAP) is a federal program that funds states to develop, operate, expand, and enhance community-based programs aimed at preventing child abuse and supporting families:

- **Primary prevention** includes efforts targeted to the broader community to strengthen families and prevent the likelihood of abuse or neglect.
- Secondary prevention efforts are targeted to special populations as a means of strengthening families and providing prevention services



PROGRAM PHILOSOPHY

- Strong community partnerships focused on child and family well-being
- Authentic engagement and partnership with individuals with lived experience to co-design, implement, and evaluate services
- Build a system that promotes family well-being throughout the life course



PROPOSAL SUMMARY

- Proposals Received: 25
 - Funding Requested: \$5,198,235
 - Estimated Funding Available*: \$1,842,892
 - FFY2024 Federal Award: \$1,623,085
 - Carry Forward from FFY2024: \$219,807

*Funding approved by KCCTF is pending Congressional budget action and formal federal award notice



FAMILY FRIENDLY WORKPLACES

The Kansas Children's Cabinet, in its role as the state Early Childhood Advisory Council, recommends adoption of the Family Friendly Workplace Survey and the Guide to Family Forward Workplaces as tools employers can use to select and implement family-friendly policies best suited to their workplace and encourages Kansas employers to implement family-friendly workplace practices, as appropriate for their business, to strengthen families, businesses, and the Kansas economy.

The Cabinet will:

- 1) include the <u>Family Friendly Workplace Survey</u> and the <u>Guide to Family Forward Workplaces</u> on the <u>All in for Kansas Kids website</u> and
- 2) encourage partners and state agencies, such as Labor and Commerce, to help Kansas employers implement family-friendly policies using existing resources.
