


The Kansas Statehouse in Topeka




Legislative Session Timeline

- Jan: Session begins
- Jan/Feb: Committees hear/work bills
- Feb: Chambers vote on bills
- March: Bills referred to and worked in opposite chamber
- April: Conference Committees & legislative break
- April/May: Action by Governor and Veto Session
- May: Session ends
